

# **I-595 Express Corridor Improvements Project Construction to Start**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District 4 will be holding a Construction Community Meeting for the I-595 Express Corridor Improvements Project on Thursday, January 28, 2010 from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Signature Grand, located at 6900 State Road 84 in Davie.

The purpose of the Construction Community Meeting is to provide property owners and interested parties throughout the corridor and South Florida with an opportunity to learn about the I-595 construction project, including the tolled reversible Express Lanes, which will be starting shortly.

The I-595 Express Corridor Improvements Project consists of the reconstruction of the I-595 mainline and all associated improvements to frontage roads and ramps from the I-75/Sawgrass Expressway interchange to just west of the I-595/I-95 interchange, for a total project length of 13 miles along the I-595 corridor and on Florida's Turnpike from Peters Road to Griffin Road.

The project improvements will be implemented as part of a public private partnership (P3) with I 595 Express, LLC, the concessionaire awarded the contract to design, build, finance, operate and maintain (DBFOM) the project for a 35 year term.
